- Tyne & Wear Archives & Museums highly recommends that group leaders conduct preliminary visits.
- Group leaders should take the behaviour and ability of their group into consideration when compiling a risk assessment.
- It is the responsibility of the group leader to monitor the behaviour and safety of their group.

Children handling replica equipment/artefacts	Dropping objects on parts of their body.	Advice given by facilitator on safe handling.	Adult supervision at all times
Children tripping or falling during object trail.	Scrapes or cuts from glass display cases, or stone objects.	Children are given instructions not to run. Children are broken up into two groups for crowd control.	Adult supervision at all times.
